Contemporary Canadian Choral Music: Truth & Reconciliation in Action and Highlights of Current Composition

Lecture by Dr. Timothy Shantz, DMus, MMus, BMus, ARCT



Dr. Timothy Shantz is a conductor, collaborator, tenor soloist, teacher and life-long dreamer. He is the Founder and Artistic Director of Calgary's professional choir, Luminous Voices, Artistic Director of the Richard Eaton Singers and the Director of Choral Activities at the University of Alberta's Department of Music. The Calgary Philharmonic Chorus and Spiritus Chamber Choir flourished during his tenure. Kenneth DeLong of the Calgary Herald wrote, "It is hard to believe that it has been a full decade since Timothy Shantz became the chorus master of the CPO Chorus. During this decade, Shantz, always energetic and full of initiative, has transformed the choral life of the city." As a conductor, Tim is recognized for the breadth of his work, from

early music to contemporary works, including virtuoso unaccompanied choral music and large choral-orchestral masterpieces. In 2021, he was honoured to receive the Richard S. Eaton Award of Distinction from Choir Alberta in recognition of exemplary service to choral music in the province of Alberta.

Tim Shantz has recorded extensively with Luminous Voices & Spiritus Chamber Choir. Recordings include *Fire-Flowers (2024) by Zachary Wadsworth*, Andrew Balfour's *Ispiciwin* (2023) (nominated for a JUNO in 2025) and *Artem Vedel: Twelve Sacred Choral Concerti & Divine Liturgy St. John Chrysostom* (2021) featuring works by one of Ukraine's finest 18th Century composers. *Sea Dreams* (2020), music of Peter-Anthony Togni, was nominated for a 2021 JUNO Award. Previous recordings include Zachary Wadsworth's *The Far West* (2016), of which Joshua Kosman of the San Francisco Chronicle wrote *"beautifully sung, as everything here is, by the aptly named Luminous Voices,"* and *Mendelssohn's Te Deum* (2015) with Luminous Voices, as well as James MacMillan's *Seven Last Words* (2014), *All the Stars Looked Down* (2012) and *of Stars and Solitude* (2010) with Spiritus Chamber Choir.

Tim holds a Doctor of Music degree in Choral Conducting from Indiana University Jacobs School of Music (DMus 2009) with a dissertation that included interviews with composer Sir James MacMillan and a conductor's analysis of his unaccompanied choral work *Sun-Dogs*. He is also a graduate of the University of Alberta's Choral Conducting program (M.Mus 1999) and earned a degree in piano performance from Wilfrid Laurier University (Hon. B.Mus 1995).

Dr. Shantz's lecture will be followed by a reading session of Canadian choral repertoire, led by select members of our tour group. Biographies of all tour participants are included on the following pages.



Laura Adlers is an arts and non-profit leader and producer based in Guelph, Ontario, who has successfully directed organizations and projects in the cultural and public sectors for more than 25 years. A life-long choral singer herself, she is internationally recognized as an award-winning administrator of community and

Current and past clients include Luminous Voices (Timothy Shantz, Calgary), The Elora Singers and Elora Festival (Mark Vuorinen, Elora), the State Choir LATVIJA (Māris Sirmais, Riga), Pax Christi Chorale (Stephanie Martin, Toronto), Orpheus Choir of Toronto (Robert Cooper, Toronto), Amadeus Choir of Greater Toronto (Lydia Adams, Toronto), and the Latvian Youth Choir BALSIS (Ints Teterovskis, Riga). Laura has been instrumental in raising the profiles of amateur and professional Latvian choirs on the world stage, producing nine international tours for BALSIS from 2009-2014, co-producing Ēriks Ešenvalds' *Nordic Light Tour* in Ontario with Robert Cooper and the Orpheus Choir of Toronto, and producing the State Choir LATVIJA's debut Canadian tour in 2019.

Laura completed a Master of Management in International Arts Management (MMIAM) in 2015, presented jointly by HEC Montréal and Southern Methodist University (Dallas). She currently serves on the Chorus America Board of Directors (Washington, DC). In 2020, Laura was appointed an Officer of the Cross of Recognition by the Republic of Latvia for her achievements in promoting Latvian culture and artists internationally. in Trombone Performance from McGill University and a Master's degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Michigan where he studied with Dr. Jerry Blackstone and Dr. Eugene Rogers.




